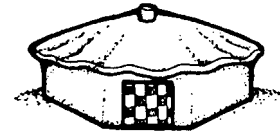

Hogan Patterns



Doorway side

Trace and cut 1.
Use brown construction paper or tagboard.
Decorate to look like logs.

Fold and tape

Sides

Trace and cut 5.
Use brown construction paper or tagboard.
Decorate to look like logs.

Fold and tape

Stovepipe

Trace and cut from black paper.

Roll into a tall tube and glue.

Insert into hole in roof.

1. Join the five sides and doorway piece with tape on the inside to form a hexagon.
2. Glue Tab A of rug to top inside of doorway.
3. Cut an 8" (20 cm) diameter paper circle for roof. (Or use flattened coffee filter or small paper plate.) Cut small hole in center of roof. Attach roof to walls with tape on inside. Insert stovepipe.
4. Set on cardboard base. Add corral, sheep, loom and surroundings to create a Navajo scene.



Rug for Doorway

- a. Trace and cut from any color.
- b. Cut along dashed lines to make a "loom."
- c. Weave with strips (about 1 cm x 4 cm) of colored construction paper.
- d. Glue at bottom to hold strips in place.
