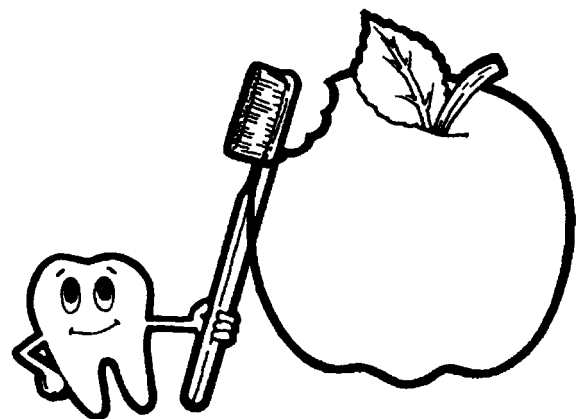
Research some facts about apples.
