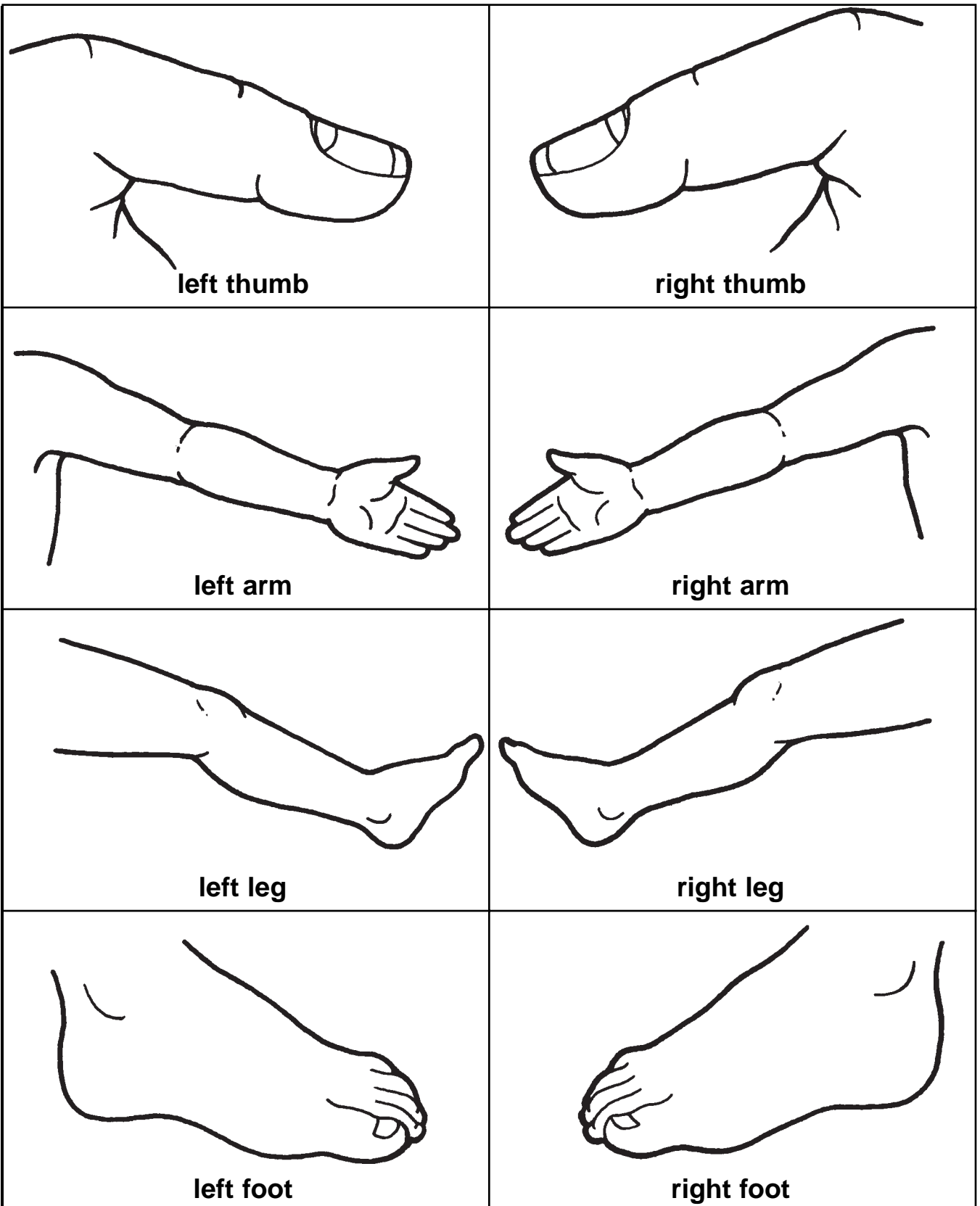

The Magic Salad Bowl— Costume Ideas *(cont.)*

Carrot Costume — No Sewing Version

Materials:

- Large white pillowcase
- Black dye (optional)
- Two large orange triangles cut from fabric or butcher paper
- Fabric glue
- Stapler
- Scissors
- Green tagboard
- Green construction paper
- Green, black, or orange tights

Directions:

Step 1: Obtain a large, white pillowcase. Dye the pillowcase black if desired.

Step 2: Cut arm holes and a neck hole in the closed end of the pillowcase.

Step 3: Cut two large orange triangles out of fabric or butcher paper for the front and back of the carrot.

Step 4: Attach the orange triangles to the pillowcase using fabric glue or the stapler.

Step 5: Make a headband using a strip of green tagboard that will fit around the student's head.

Step 6: Make leaves using green construction paper and stapling the leaves onto the headband.

Step 7: Have the student wear tights.
