

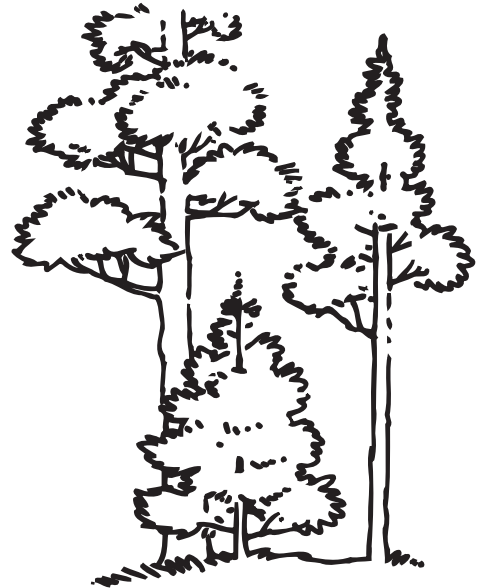

# Putting Together *Redwood National Park*

## Materials

Each student will need:

- copies of text and templates
- clear tape
- a sheet of green construction paper
- a sheet of brown construction paper

## Assembly Directions for *Redwood National Park* Folded Book

1. Cut each page on the dashed lines.
2. Lay out each of the 4 pages end to end as shown in the illustration.
3. Tape the pages together (on the short sides) so that they can be fan-folded on the seams, as shown in the illustration. Note: Place tape on the back of the page.
4. The branches section of the tree comes in two parts. Cut out each part and glue them together, matching the dashed lines.
5. Fold a piece of green construction paper lengthwise.
6. Place the straight edge of the branches pattern on the fold of the green paper. Trace the edges. Cut out the green branches and unfold the paper.
7. Trace the three tree-trunk pieces and the flap onto the brown construction paper and cut out the four pieces.
8. Glue trunk pieces on pages 1–4 within the dashed lines. Tape the bark flap to the middle section of the trunk. Be sure to leave the bark flap free of glue.
9. Place glue onto the back of the tree branches on the top section. Leave the bottom section of the branches hanging off the page as shown in the illustration. Attach this green section to the first page (top) of the book.
10. Cut out title and the text sections. Place the title and text strip 1 on the top section of the redwood tree.
11. The small text box listing the tree layers fits on the inside of the flap on page 3 (middle trunk section).
12. The rest of the text strips can be placed in numerical order along the trunk. Place the text so that it can be read when the book is unfolded vertically.
