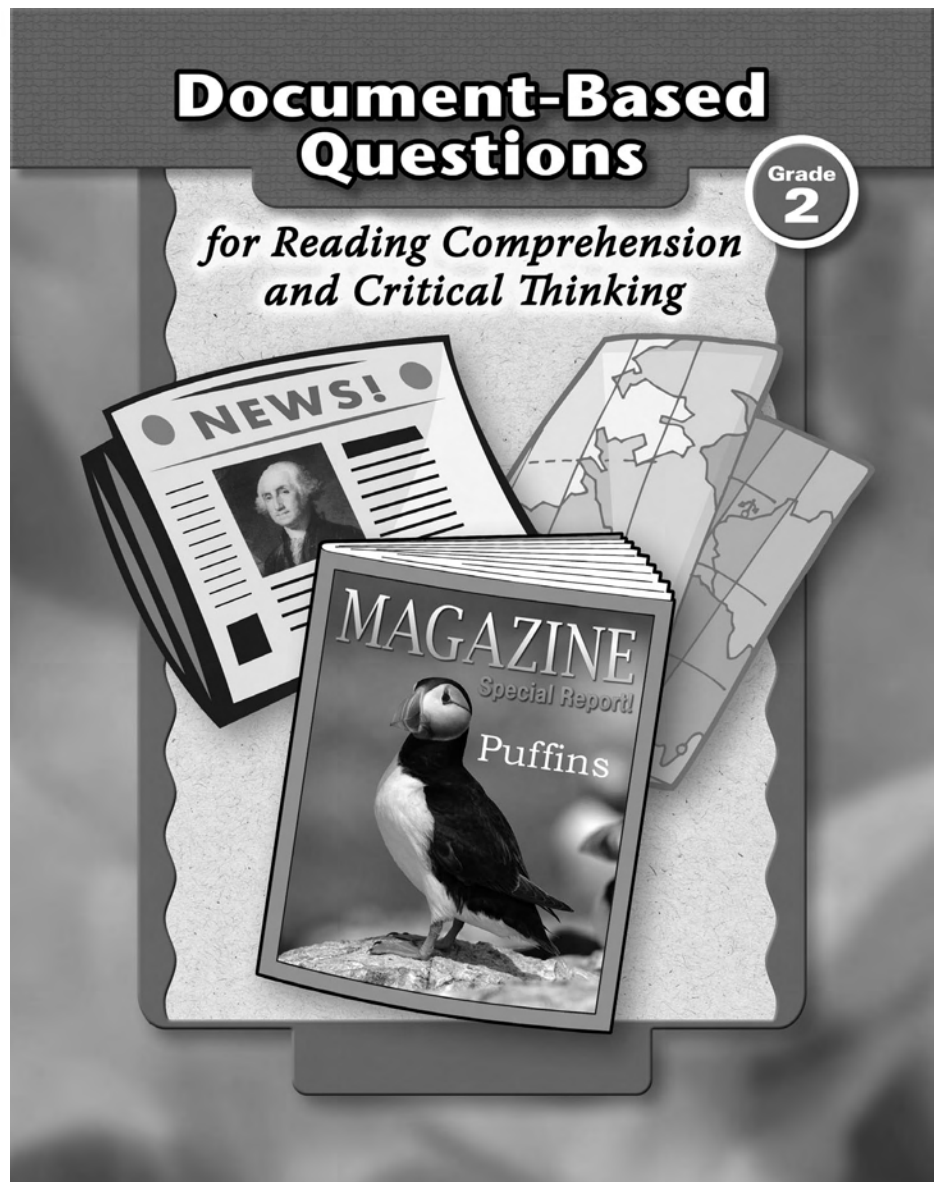

This is the glossary from a book about antelopes. It tells what some of the words used in the book mean.

GLOSSARY

bovine (BOH veen)—animals that have two horns, eat plants, and chew cud

habitat (HAB uh tat)—the kind of place where an animal lives

herd—a group of large, hooved animals such as antelopes, goats, and deer

predator (PRED uh tor)—an animal that hunts and eats other animals

prey (PRAY)—an animal that is hunted by another animal

savanna (suh VAN uh)—grassland with few trees in Africa

species (SPEE sheez)—one kind of animal in a group of related animals; dik-diks and elands are species of antelopes
